### Elsinore voters could decide fate of 8,244-home project

A developer-supported citizens' coalition in Lake Elsinore has received approval to begin the initiative process in an attempt to have the massive Alberhill Villages project placed on the November ballot.

The 8,244-home, mixed-use development would be built over 30 years on 1,400 acres between Lake Street and the city's border adjacent to Horsethief Canyon Ranch in Temescal Valley.

The development's Specific Plan was approved June 14 by the City Council with several city-imposed conditions that developer Castle & Cooke opposes and would prefer that the project's future be decided by city voters.

Among the conditions placed on the developer is the construction of an almost 46-acre, multi-million dollar sports park and the formation of a community facilities district that would tax homeowners for police and fire services.

The citizens' group now faces an Aug. 12 deadline to gather about 2,000 signatures from registered voters to place the initiative on the November ballot.

If the required number of signatures is obtained and voters approve the project, City Attorney Barbara Liebold has said the vote "would probably supersede the city's approval," eliminating the city's control over the development. Learn more: WeAreTV.org

#### **Olsen Canyon Mine Update**

It appears the county's application process that could eventually lead to a permit being issued for a mining operation in Olsen Canyon is running behind schedule.

In the meantime, mining representatives continue to make presentations before Temescal Valley homeowners' associations to answer questions about the proposed mine they want to locate in the foothills behind the Wildrose Business Park.

Latest developments: Wildrose Ranch HOA members were told Olsen Canyon, at its own expense, would erect an air monitoring station at the mine. Also, Temescal Valley Water District still maintains it lacks the water necessary to sustain the mining operation and has denied the mine's "will serve" request.

# Acker-Stone wants to extend permit and expand storage area

## Owner of storage yard on TCR seeks county OK to operate for 7 more years

The owner of a storage yard, which has been operating under a temporary use permit, is seeking county approval of a plot plan application that would extend the use for seven more years.

The yard, located at 12705 Temescal Canyon Road between Indian Truck Trail and Horsethief Canyon Road, is used to store contractor's materials associated with freeway construction and repairs.

A representative of the property owner, **Peterson/Chase General Engineering Construction**, met with members of the **WeAreTV Development Committee** in September to discuss the project.

Committee members voiced concerns about the appearance of the yard which has been described as an "eyesore," and were told that plans call for vine-covered, six-foot chain link fencing and tall shrubs to mask the area from public view.

Members questioned how graffiti would be controlled, and suggested that K-rail not be stacked as high as it is now. Another concern was security lighting for evening hours.
