

We Are Temescal Valley, 92883

- An unincorporated area of 19.3 square miles originally called Rancho Temescal (pronounced "teh mes CUL") nestled in a valley between the Cleveland National Forest and the Temescal Mountains. We are governed by Riverside County.
- Situated along the I-15 corridor south of the city of Corona and north of the city of Lake Elsinore. Bordered by Weirick Road to the north and just north of Lake Street to the south.
- Rich with history. Home to the early Luiseno and Gabrieleno Native American tribes. First non-native settler in Riverside County arrived in 1818 and built his first adobe in 1824. The route of the Southern Emigrant Trail aligned closely with today's Temescal Canyon Road and was used by settlers and gold seekers, including John Fremont. Temescal Canyon Road also was the route for the Butterfield Overland Mail coaches, which traveled between St. Louis and San Francisco from 1858 to 1861.
- The Valley has been mined since the early 1900s for natural resources including silica, aggregate and clay. Acre upon acre of Valley groves played a major role in the booming citrus industry.
- 28,227 residents living in 9,178 housing units of which 98.2% are owner occupied. About 500 homes are now under construction. 950 homes have been approved but are yet to be built, and there are over 800 homes in the planning process. Several new retail/industrial businesses are planned.
- Home to Tom's Farms and the 158-year-old Glen Ivy Hot Springs. Glen Ivy RV Park, Glen Eden Sun Club and the Skull Canyon Zipline also attract visitors. Many shopping opportunities with small businesses in the Valley, the outlet malls to the south and The Crossings and Dos Lagos centers to the north.
- Full golfing experiences with Trilogy Glen Ivy course. Nearby courses at Dos Lagos and Eagle Glen.
- The communities of The Retreat, Wildrose Ranch, Montecito Ranch, Trilogy, Sycamore Creek, Sycamore Hills, Butterfield Estates, Glen Ivy, Painted Hills, Horsethief Canyon Ranch, Spanish Hills, Dawson Canyon, Terramor, California Meadows, Creekside, Canyon Oaks, Lemon Grove, Glen Eden, Serrano and Sycamore Highlands. Plus rural estate homes and horse properties in Wierick and Hunt/Lawson neighborhoods.
- Proud of our community schools Temescal Valley Elementary in Wildrose Ranch, Todd Academy in Sycamore Creek and Luiseno School in Horsethief Canyon Ranch.
